<p><b>Type of group/course</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Parent Groups</b></p> <p>Some schools hold groups for parents and carers aimed at providing support, friendship and information. While other schools within the Rotherham area have groups aimed at helping parents with specific issues i.e. Children's behaviour, relationships within the home and learning new skills to either help with their child's education or provide a stepping stone to other courses or career moves for the adults in the family.</p>
